



PRESS RELEASE: 9TH November 2020

Since March 2020 Nullarbor Links the World's longest Golf Course has been closed due to Covid 19, and the closure of the SA/WA border. The course was unplayable because Golfers were required to isolate for 14 days once they had crossed the border. With the situation that WA and SA don't have community transmitted Corona Virus now, the Western Australian Government has decided to open the border and not require golfers from South Australia, Tasmania, Northern Territory and Queensland to isolate for any period of time.

As of Sunday the 15th November Nullarbor Links will again be opened for golfers from those States mentioned, to play the entire course from either end. The cost will remain the same \$70 per golfer and certificates will be available both at Kalgoorlie and Ceduna Visitor's Centre. The course will be in tip top condition and we hope you will enjoy playing the World's Longest Golf Course.

Chasing the Sun golf tournament 2021 will also return and will commence at Ceduna on Saturday May the 1st and conclude in Kalgoorlie on Saturday 8th May. Nominations for the event are open on our website www.nullarborlinks.com:
