The World's Longest Golf Course

The Nullarbor Links Golf Course is unique. The 18-hole par 72 golf course spans 1,365 kilometres with one hole in each participating town or roadhouse along the Eyre Highway, from Kalgoorlie in Western Australia to Ceduna in South Australia.

Each hole includes a synthetic green, tee and somewhat rugged outback-style natural terrain fairway. The course provides a quintessential Australian experience and a much needed activity/attraction for travellers along one of Australia's greatest road journeys.

So, how do you play the course?

Purchase your score card at the Ceduna, Kalgoorlie or Norseman visitors centre play your holes and have your card stamped at the service stations or visitors centres along the way. On completion of the course you will receive a completion certificate.
